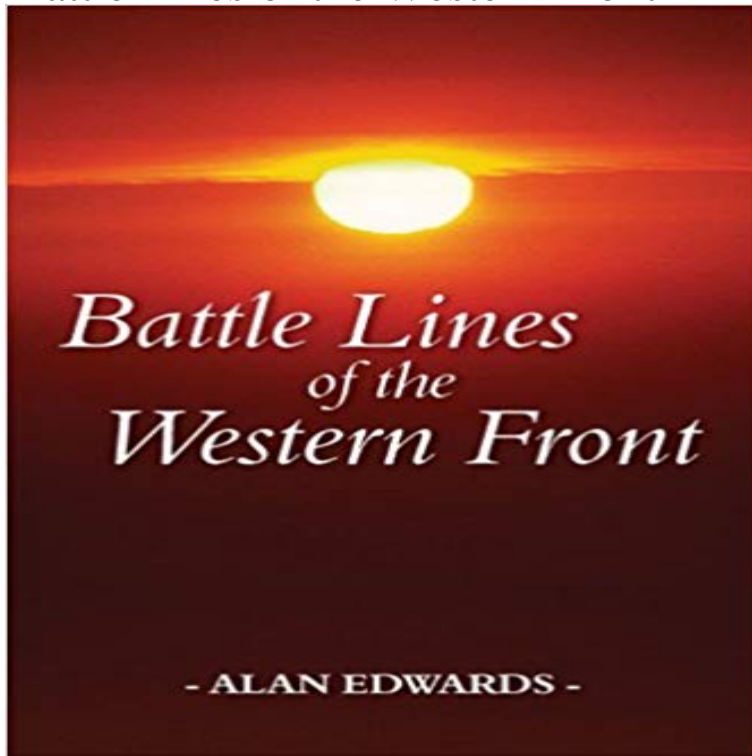


## Battle Lines of the Western Front
