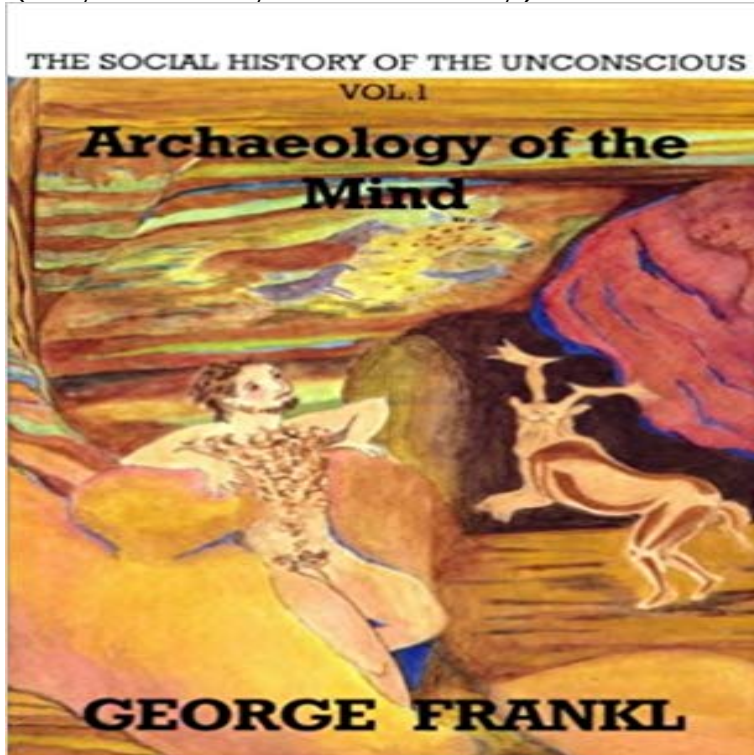


## Social History of the Unconscious: Volume I: Archaeology of the Mind (Psychoanalysis & society)
