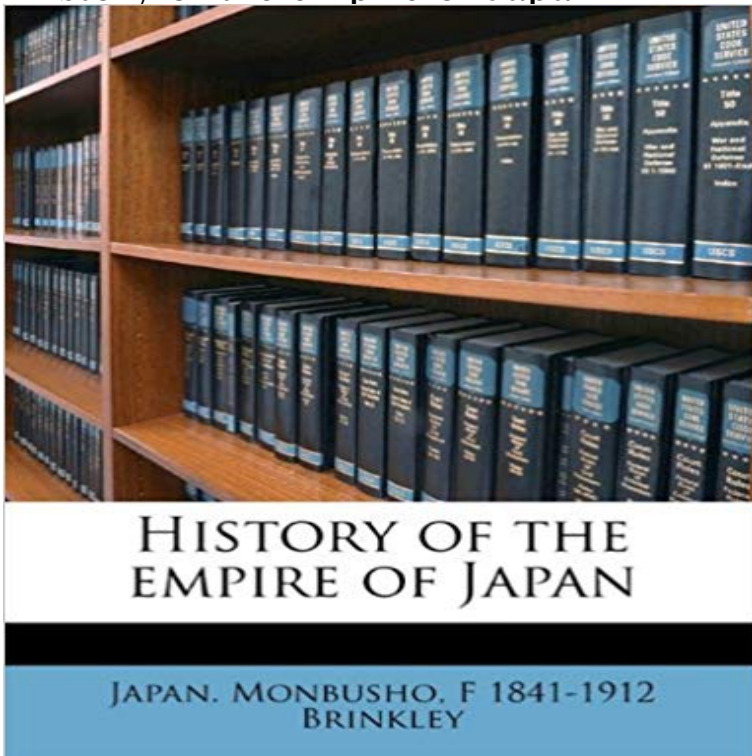


## History of the empire of Japan
